Special Interview with Music Female Doctor Sun Yue

One of The Independent Creative Third Class

At the beginning of this year, the editor witnessed the closing concert of Guangzhou International Youth Music Week. The whole concert was impressive, especially the last encore Improvisational performance of violin solo. After the concert, the editor hurried immediately to the backstage to congratulate the musicians expecting to meet this violinist who delivered the last violin solo. But to his surprise, the girl was already surrounded by the crowds in excitement. They all wanted to meet her. The prestigious cellist Huang Xinyun and renowned Russian American pianist Anna Polonsky commented her as the "most shining rising star" of the night. The person enjoying this popularity is the one we are interviewing, Sun Yue, a US-based violinist.

To be myself, never copy others

Sun Yue, a girl follows her own way. Since she was young, she loves challenge and try new things. With her good music talents, she followed Prof. Huang Zhongbo who taught her dedicatedly. She was admitted to Music Middle School Affiliated to Shanghai Conservatory of Music of world top teaching facilities at the top of all external candidates throughout the nation at the age of 13.

Following her entry to the Music Middle School, unlike others who are mainly focus on how to become a performer, Sun Yue threw herself into learning ensemble. She used to win the opportunity to Hotchkiss Chamber Music Festival in US with full scholarship as a student representative from Music Middle School Affiliated to Shanghai Conservatory of Music. Following her graduation from senior middle school, Sun Yue was selected by Prof. Melvin Chen from Yale University to Bard College Conservatory of Music, US for her bachelor degree with full scholarship and full subsidy of living expenses. It is said that the music students are practicing all the time but not interested in general knowledge courses, but Sun Yue is an exception. During her undergraduate study, Sun Yue chose two of the most difficult majors in the school, violin performance and psychology. In 2012, she graduated from Bard College and became the only Chinese with dual bachelor degrees in violin performance and psychology. Sun Yue immediately drew lots of eyes in the circles for her independent personality and active performance on the modern music stage. In this April, she received invitation from Shattered Glass, the first and only non-conductor string orchestra from New York and followed Shattered Glass to tour performance throughout US performing various modern programs of different styles.

Music angel, shining on major international stages

Sun Yue was majored in classic violin performance. Most of her peers focus only on performance of classic works. However, Sun Yue appears in performances of varies modern music. She's been bustling on the stage of series concert "Music Alive". She discussed and jointly performed new works with John Tower, the renowned female American composer and Grammy winner. In 2011, she stood out from the Bard College Selection and served as one of the violin soloists, and collaborated with George Tsoniakis, the Grammy nominated American composer in performance of double violin concerto "Unforgettable" by George Tsoniakis during the tour performance in Harvard University. Sun Yue also completed the premiere of "Five Dances", the piece adapted by Eric Salzman for string quartet from that for percussion composed by John Cage in New York, US, the recording at site becomes the only recording material around the globe.

Expectation to bridge Sino-US music culture communication

Different from many violinists, Sun Yue, endowed with dual cultural background of China and America, performs not only western music with violin, but also Chinese music with as much enthusiasm as she devotes to Sino-US music culture communication. In China, she used to follow Bard College Symphony to seven cities for tour performance and completed premiere of works by American composer Ives. In US, she performed Chinese works from time to time on her concerts and held speech concert special for Chinese classic program "Butterfly Lovers" in State University of New York at Stony Brook, receiving positive feedback from the American audience. Speaking of Sino-US music culture, Sun Yue expressed that she's dreaming of becoming the bridge between the two countries to deliver borderless music.

Best seller album "Passion" brings Chinese music to the world


In early 2017, Sun Yue's violin solo album "Passion" was published by Shanghai Audio-visual Publishing House. Within months, the sales surpassed any of its kind of the same period, receiving positive feedback from the fan.

Most of the programs in the album integrate modern creative style and Chinese elements, supplementing as a valuable one for the audio materials of Chinese modern violin works. Eight of the programs are new creations and mostly are world premieres as "Passion" and "Melody of Turtledove" etc..

The album "Passion" is favored a lot by the mass music lovers. In the end of 2017, it was republished with notation by Shanghai Music Publishing House on invitation. Nevertheless, "Passion" has been also distributed to US and interested records companies as Centaur and Albany for publication, addressing that both the music and the performance of the album are appealing. To bring Chinese music to more people, Sun Yue chose to cooperation with Skillman Records, N.Y. (former partner of many renowned Chinese musicians as Lang Lang etc.) and published audio version of "Passion" to the world on the New Year's Day of 2018.

As Sun Yue expressed, she hope that there're more people not like love Chinese music, but also are willing to learn how to perform Chinese music. The album "Passion" will be an valuable material for their learning of Chinese music performance.

Shatter challenge, generous and graceful, confident and creative

Sun Yue's way to performance is not always smooth. She's born small with short arms and thin fingers. But she never gives up to difficulty due to her inherent defects. Independent and brave as she is, she can always find ways out to shatter the game rules.

She used to serve America Youth Symphony as the Chief under emergency without preparation, leading the team of over one hundred and performing the solo part of the Chief. Her grace and confidence form a sharp comparison with her small figure,

impressing people at site and proving that short people also can be good chiefs; she used to serve the Orchestra of Guangzhou International Music Week as improvisational soloist without any improvisational background conditions, bringing down the house with her excellent performance and interesting creation which also gained appreciation from world famous Chinese cellist Yo-Yo Ma and renowned Shinese musician Yu Long. Her performance on the stage, also convicted wrong that she's unqualified for improvisational solo due to her small size and zero background. What worth mentioning is that she didn't follow rules of technique but created a pressing technique of "double-finger fifth" (single finger fifth normally), improving the intonation and sounding quality of the dual-tone fifth and allowing the persons with thin fingers to accomplish the fifth as well. The violinist Phillip Setzer from the world top string quartet Emerson Ensemble commented that Sun Yue's "double-finger fifth" is very innovative and makes the fifth easier."

Nanchang Daily once commented that Sun Yue "fuses passionate performance unparalleled music charm", and "New York Lounge" of SinoVision even conducted special interview with Sun Yue for her new album and technique innovation. Sun Yue has her footprint throughout Europe, America and Asia. The major halls she used to perform in include The Carnegie Hall, Konzerthaus Berlin, National Theatre (Prague), Warsaw Philharmonic Hall, National Centre for the Performing Arts, etc.. The world famous conductor Eschenbach once praised her as "a rare talent of roaring flame and infectious passion." We have all our ears up for her next brilliant performance!
